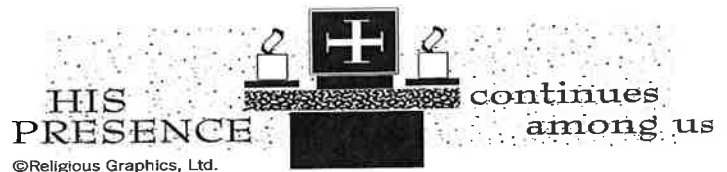

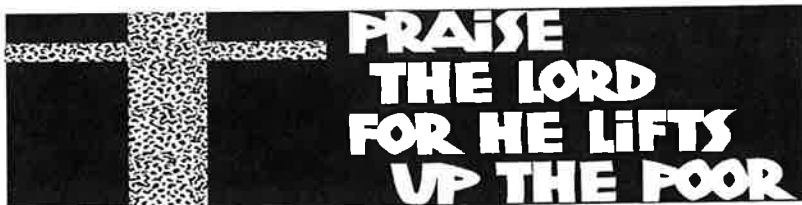

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

FEAST DAY
SEPTEMBER 27

{Patron saint of charitable societies}

Saint Vincent de Paul was born in 1580, in Pouy, Gascony, France. He was the third of six children and the son of poor farmers. Although his family didn't have much, Vincent always gave whenever he could. Once a poor person asked Vincent for money and he gave all that he had in his pocket—twelve cents.

Vincent was an intelligent boy. Though his parents weren't wealthy, they sent Vincent away to Dax for an education. A local lawyer employed him to be a tutor for his children and Vincent continued his studies. He attended college at the University of Saragossa, in Spain, and later the University of Toulouse, in France. By age 20, he was ordained by the bishop of Perigoux, but stayed in Toulouse earning a doctorate degree in theology. After his ordination, a woman left Vincent some money and the name of a man indebted to her. He tracked down the man in a distant city and collected the remaining money. On the way back to France, a stranger convinced him to take the boat home. The boat was captured by pirates and Vincent was sold into slavery. During this time, he fully realized that when you have nothing, the only help you have is God.

Vincent eventually escaped and made his way back to France. In 1609, he was sent on a mission by King Henry. Then he became chaplain to Queen Margaret of Valois in Paris. In the



years following, he worked with the poor and his preaching attracted immense attention.

There he met his contemporary, Francis de Sales, and became a disciple. Francis appointed Vincent ecclesiastical superior. During his lifetime, Vincent was a tutor in a count's household, general of the galleys, and minister to the slaves.

In 1625, Vincent founded the Congregation of the Mission, known as the Vincentians. They devoted themselves to working with the peasants, and the congregation spread across France. He also established parish lay organizations, which worked within the congregation to aid the poor. In 1633, he and Louise de Marillac founded the Sisters of Charity. He established many

hospitals and orphanages, ransomed Christian slaves in northern Africa, founded seminaries, sent priests abroad to preach missions, organized relief programs for war-torn areas, and wrote on various spiritual topics. Vincent persuaded many of Paris' rich and famous women to come together and help those in need, forming the Ladies of Charity.

Vincent devoted his entire life to helping others, trying to alleviate human suffering and misery. The 85 year-old saint died in September 1660 after receiving the last sacraments. Vincent was canonized in 1737 and later proclaimed patron of charitable societies.

*"...if you consider the poor in the light of faith,
then you will observe that they are taking the place
of the Son of God who chose to be poor. Although in his passion
he almost lost the appearance of a man and was considered
a fool by the Gentiles and a stumbling block to the Jews,
he showed them that his mission was to preach to the poor."*
