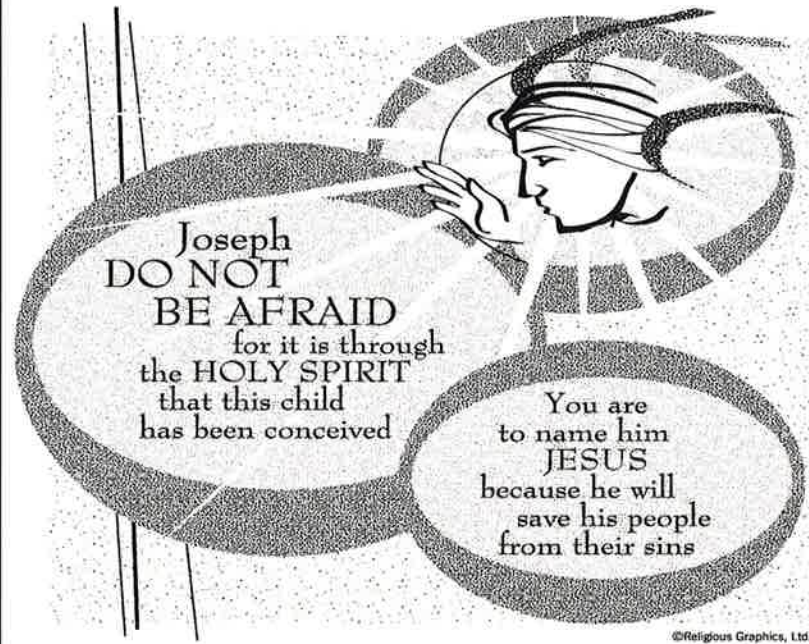
PreK—Fifth Grade classes resume January 5th, 2014

# SAINT JOHN THE APOSTLE

FEAST DAY  
DECEMBER 27

{Patron saint of Asia Minor}

**S**on, brother, apostle, caretaker, and author, John bore a lot of responsibility for his time.

Born in Galilee, John was the son of Zebedee, and the brother of James the Greater. It is believed that John was the younger brother because he is mentioned after James. Fishermen by profession, John and James were partners with Simon Peter.

John strongly believed in God's word. He was angered by those who didn't believe in Jesus. One example of John's fiery intensity can be found in Luke 9:54. His zealous actions were sometimes the source of trouble which often endangered his life.

There are many legends regarding John's later life. A notable one is that of the Emperor Domitian



and John. The emperor sent for John in Rome, where he was beaten, poisoned, and thrown into a boiling cauldron of oil. But John had God on his side. John stepped out of the cauldron completely unharmed. Frustrated by John's survival, Domitian had John exiled to the island of Patmos for a year. John later lived in Ephesus, where it is believed he wrote some of his works.

Known as the Apostle of Charity, John incorporated all that he learned from Jesus in word and example. It is said that John believed that to really know Jesus was not to focus on the historical person, but as he comes to all in the experience of grace.

John lived to be over 100 years old. He died in Ephesus, the last of the apostles.

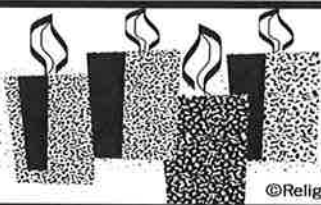

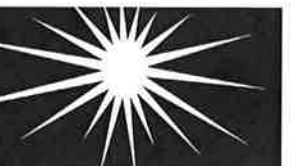


