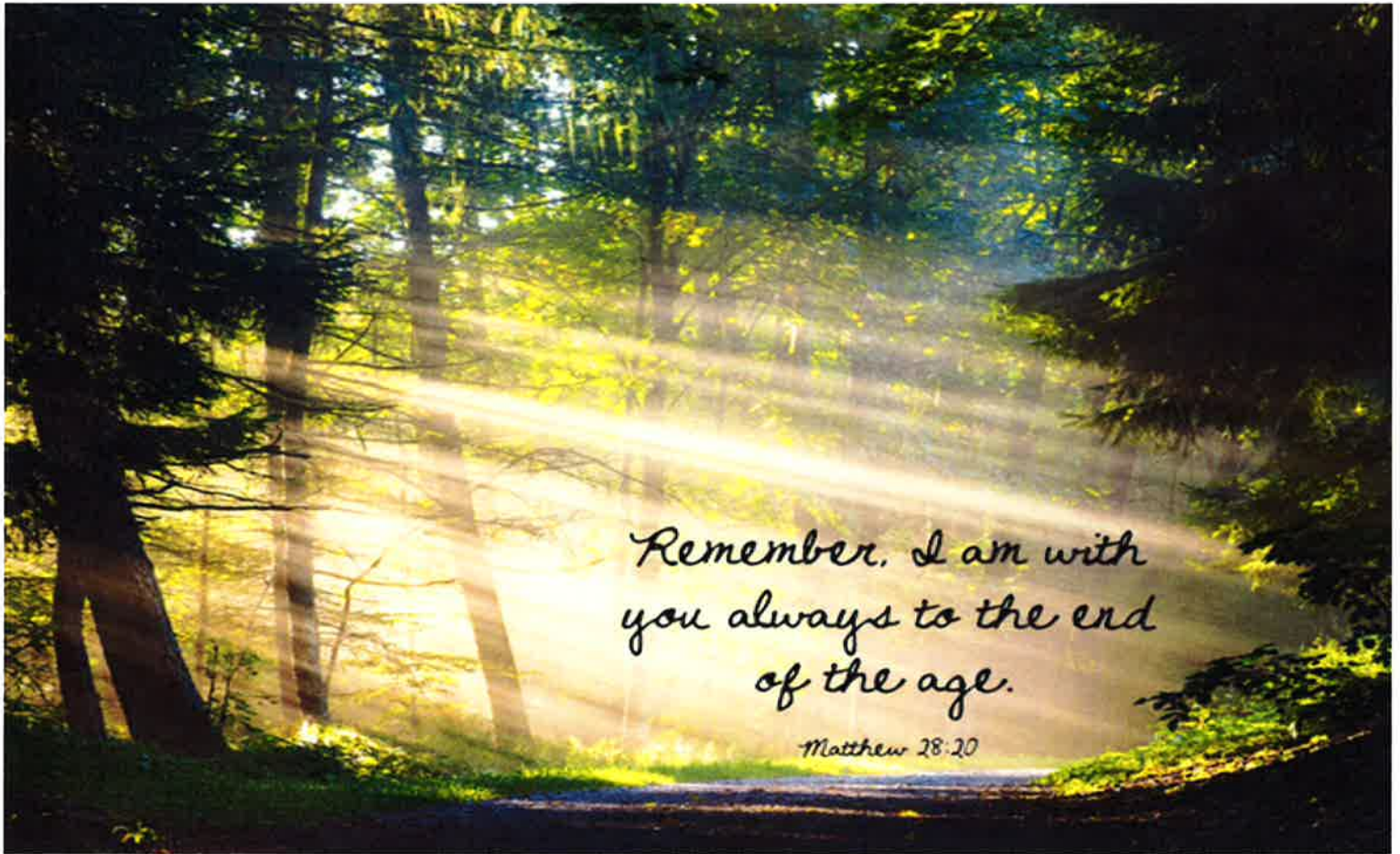

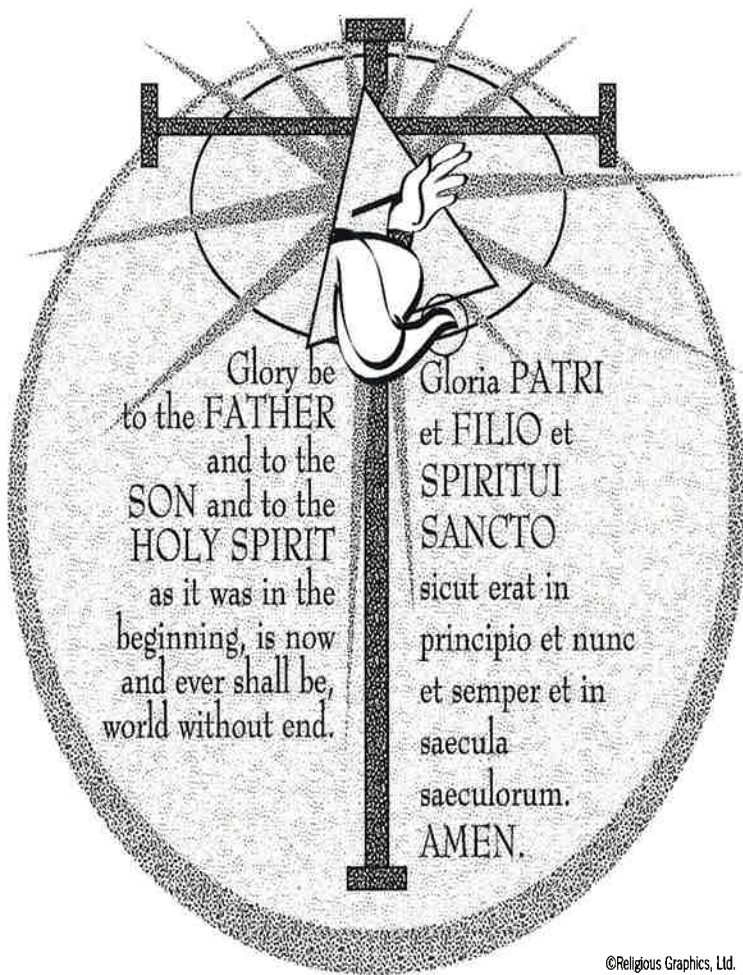


Religious Education

SAINT CHARLES LWANGA

FEAST DAY

JUNE 3

{Patron saint of converts, youth, and torture victims}

Born in 1860, Charles' life made a significant mark in Church history. He was one of the few African martyrs who brought Catholicism to great heights in his native Uganda.

The Society of Missionaries of Africa established a community of followers whose faith and devotion outshined their own. These converts soon instructed others who couldn't otherwise be reached in King Mwanganga's court. One of those who received instruction was Charles Lwanga.

King Mwanganga was a violent ruler, physically as well as verbally. He forced himself upon the young pages who served in the court. He also abused those young Christian men who tried vehemently to protect the pages. The small community of 200 was led by the 25 year-old Catholic chief steward of Mwanganga's court, Joseph Mkasa. Mkasa was beheaded and burned to death in 1885 after confronting and challenging the king about the unnecessary murder of a Protestant missionary. Though Mkasa and Mwanganga were friends, that meant nothing. Mkasa's final plea for Mwanganga's repentance must have been heard. Mwanganga had slowed down his persecution on the innocent. It was also this year that Charles requested and received his baptism.

After Mkasa's death, Charles took over instruction and leadership of the thriving court community. Now, he was the protector of the other young men.

In May 1886, persecution was revitalized. A page, Mwafu, was summoned to return to Mwanganga. When questioned about his absence, Mwafu told the king he was receiving religious instruction from Dennis Sebuggwawo. Again the king was



angry. Dennis' life was taken by the king himself, spearing Dennis' throat. Mwanganga ordered the royal compound to be sealed and guarded. No one was going to escape the executioners. In preparation for this, Charles baptized four catechumens that same night.

When Mwanganga gathered his court, he weeded out those who prayed—regardless of religious background. These men, all members of the community, including Charles, were sentenced to death. Their execution took place 37 miles away, in the city of Namugongo. The chief executioner, Senkole, begged his own son to flee, but he refused. These courageous men would die for their beliefs.

In addition to Catholics and Anglicans, there were approximately eight non-Christians in prison. After some instruction, only two of the non-Christians didn't pray. Two Anglicans spoke with the executioner, Senkole, on behalf of the two men. Their lives were spared.

As the execution began, Charles was singled out. The executioner had special plans to torture Charles, slowly and painfully, until his death. Charles was tied to a low stake and burned. Although the pain was excruciating, Charles never gave up. He continued to pray, thinking first of his executioner's soul. Quietly, Charles encouraged the executioner to embrace his religion. He simply snickered in Charles' face. Little did Senkole know that he would himself later become a catechumen.

By 1887, there were 500 Christians and approximately 1,000 catechumens in Uganda.

Charles was beatified in 1920. He was declared patron saint of Catholic youth and Catholic Action in 1934. Twenty-two men, including Charles Lwanga, were canonized in 1964.
