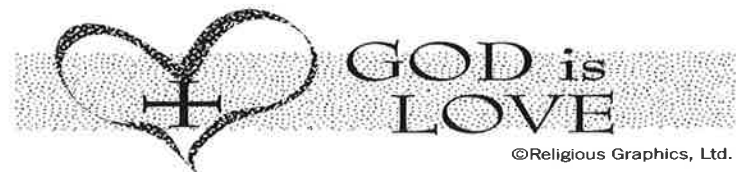

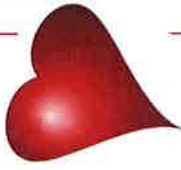

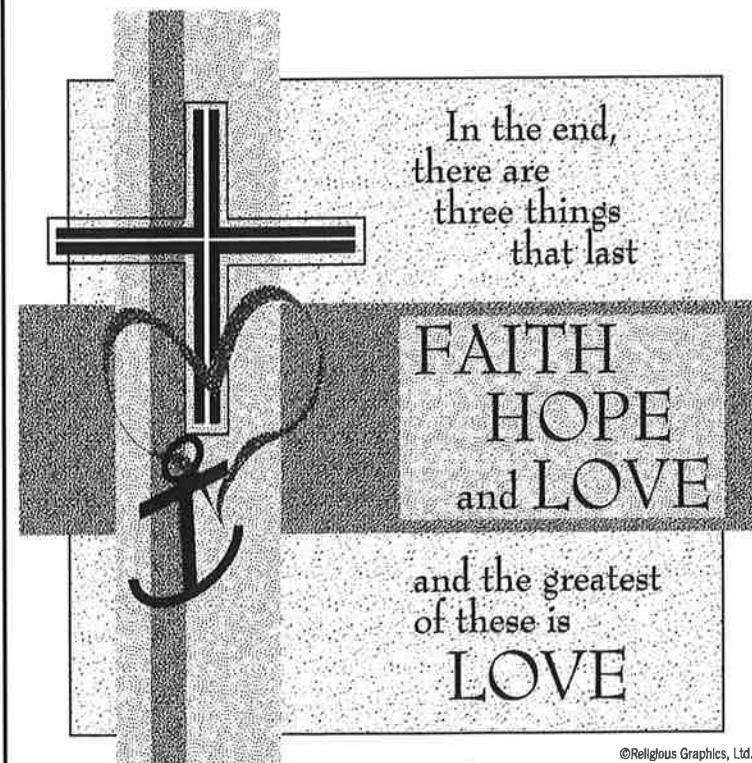

Jubilee Year of Mercy

January 31, 2016

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Rave reviews greeted Jesus' first hometown homily proclaiming a year of God's mercy, but the mood turned violent when he went on to declare that God's mercy embraces outsiders; it rejects distinctions between citizen and foreigner, acceptable and unworthy, even sinner and saint. Far from being anyone's personal possession, God's kingdom is open to everyone, God's love unconditional, God's mercy boundless. By this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis repeats Jesus' challenge in today's Gospel to broaden our horizons until our vision matches Jesus' vision of every sinner as a potential saint, and each suffering stranger as our neighbor. Jesus, says Pope Francis, continually went beyond the law, keeping company with public sinners and even sharing meals with them to demonstrate that God's mercy is "the beating heart of the Gospel" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12). To be truly Jesus' disciples, such unconditional love and boundless mercy must also be at the center of all we say and do.



2015 YEAR END REPORT OF ACTIONS BY OUR LADY OF THE LAKE CONFERENCE OF THE SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT de PAUL

Dear Parishioners,

After only four months of operation the Conference took 48 calls on our helpline and our volunteers handled eighteen cases. Of the eighteen cases we helped sixteen cases, one is still open and one, we could not help because they terminated the case on their own. We had seven cases, who needed their rent paid or face eviction from their home. With \$2,138.31 we prevented twenty people from becoming homeless.

For \$651.49 we helped four homeless people (two were children) find temporary shelter until they were able to find permanent housing. For \$132.06 we helped a parish member and her family buy perishable foods to stock her refrigerator with milk, eggs, fresh vegetables and meats and they were extremely grateful to all of you, our parishioners. We also helped a long time parishioner who needed immediate surgery on her eyes or face blindness by paying the insurance deductible. She had the surgery about two weeks ago and is now healing nicely and the surgery was successful and she will be able see again. We are the most proud of being able to help this person. Another case of help for a parishioner was to pay for an eye exam and glasses for an eleven year old daughter of a parishioner who is doing well in school now with new glasses enabling her to see the blackboard. We helped another parishioner buy license tags for a truck that they needed to use for their self-owned business. We also helped two other families from having their electric power shut off for failure to pay the electric bill and they were able to keep their homes warm during this last spell of cold weather.

These are just a few of the cases where Our Lady of the Lake Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul provided financial help to those in need with the money that you so generously donated to our ministry. Our volunteers invested one hundred and twenty two man hours in doing case work and eleven hours per person in case work training. They drove their personal vehicles over 1,648 miles at their own expense driving to recipients homes to interview them. Yes, we don't just hand money out and pay bills without first interviewing them and get a good understanding of their financial situation and make sure that after we help them, that they will be able to help themselves in the future. Numerous hours were spent on the phone by our Case Coordinator and our case workers and many more hours were spent by case workers at in-house office work.

This was all done in four months but, our work is not all about numbers; it is all about doing what our Lord Jesus Christ and his Vicar on earth, Pope Francis has urged us to do---"help those who are living in poverty"! Jesus has said in many ways and at many times "FEED MY LAMBS".

Your financial donations have enabled us to do the Lord's work and we ask you to keep us in mind when you think about charitable giving. Put your checks or cash in a plain envelope, make your check payable to OLOL/SVDP and mark the outside of the envelope in a similar manner so that those counting our weekly donations will be able to credit your donation to our account. All of the members of OLOL Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul thank you for all that you have done and what you will do in the future.
