

PRIESTLY POSTS

5 things you may not know about our Associate Pastor, Father Thomas Kalam At the age of seven, I started serving Mass in my parish church. It was my mother who was behind this early start. The moment I got up in the morning, I wanted my breakfast on the table; otherwise, I used to create a scene which mother could not manage. Indian breakfast is always a cooked breakfast – with pancakes and so on. So my mother approached the pastor and asked him to train me to serve mass. Those days we were not allowed to eat anything before communion. We had two masses in the church every morning, at 6 am and 7 am. I was happy to serve both these masses. By the time, I went back home after the masses, my mother could manage to get ready with breakfast for the whole family. So the roots of my liturgical life lie in my ravenous hunger early in the morning!

I joined the seminary at the age of 13. Once again my mother was responsible for this early start. She died at the age of 38 of meningitis. I was 10 years old and being very attached to my mother, I was miserable living in my home without her. So I approached the associate pastor of the parish who was a Carmelite priest, enquiring about the possibility of me joining the seminary immediately. Those days they used to accept boys to seminaries at the age of 13 onwards. So I joined the Carmelite seminary no sooner I reached the age of 13. I completed my high school studies from the Seminary. My father as a student was being groomed to become a priest. In God's providence and my luck, he got married to my mother. He was thrilled when one of his five sons became a priest.

I was ordained at the age of 26 in India. Immediately after that I was sent to Europe for higher studies. I pursued my studies in Italy, Germany, France, Ireland, England and US – completing three master's degrees (in Philosophy, Moral Theology and Psychology). I was awarded a Ph. D. from Lancaster University, U. K. on the basis of my doctoral research from 1977 to 1980 under the guidance of the famous cognitive developmental psychologist Lawrence Kohlberg of Harvard University.

While working at Harvard, I was assigned to a parish as a priest in residence. The pastor Monsignor George Bardes was like a dad to me. The parish became my family. People were so loving and appreciative. When I finished my studies and had to go home to India, my heart was almost broken. I was so attached to that community. I spent almost 30 years in India. I worked as a professor in a major seminary and St. John's, a 1250 bed teaching hospital owned by the Bishops of India. In between I served my Order as Provincial Superior. The last 8 years of my life in India I was appointed as the Director/CEO of St. John's. Fortunately it was a two term job. So I could retire early

after the second term. The dormant nostalgia for the parish where I worked during my studies in the US, drew me to the US. At that time, Bishop Choby, who was on a visit to India, a year after his Episcopal ordination, visited me at St. John's. He invited me to Nashville, when I retire from my job at St. John's. Finally my dream of being in a parish became a reality when I joined Our Lady of the Lake parish. It is once more a Camelot!

This summer we say goodbye to our seminarian, **Javier Suarez**. He has been such a wonderful help with our Hispanic ministry as well as other needs around the parish. THANK YOU for your service to our parish community. He will be greatly missed and we wish him all success and blessings as he continues his studies.

She spends her life in prayer, from the time she wakes to the time she falls asleep. Her life <u>is</u> a prayer. She used to attend daily Mass at Our Lady of the Lake and had signed up for multiple hours in Eucharistic Adoration. She encouraged others to sign up, too. She would promote Eucharistic Adoration every chance she got. She collected articles and quotes on Eucharistic Adoration and passed them out. She believes in the grace and spiritual benefits that come from spending time with the Lord and also an increase of priestly and religious vocations.

Three years ago, due to poor blood circulation, both her legs were amputated above the knee. She has lived in a rehab facility with long term care since then. Her chapel is now her room. She prays from her bed or the wheelchair, surrounded by prayer books, those articles she collected, and images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Blessed Mother. She 'attends' daily Mass now by watching it on EWTN. She feels blessed to have friends bring her Communion. She encourages everyone she comes in contact with to say simply "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus". God is still using this prayer warrior for His glory and praise.

She follows in the bulletin how many slots are still open in Eucharistic Adoration and still does what she can to spread the message of love for Jesus in adoration. Please consider spending a Holy Hour with the Lord so He will not be alone in the chapel. You will find how peaceful it is to just sit with Him, giving thanks and

asking for His help and lifting up others...and feel His presence. Let's fill those hours and grow in faith and realize, like she does, that just being in His presence is a prayer.

OLOL Mission for St. Bertin in Haiti

During mission trips to St. Bertin, OLOL's twin parish in Petit Bourg de Port Margot, Haiti, members of the OLOL Mission team have seen and touched extreme poverty and living conditions we cannot believe exist in the world today. These encounters drive our determination to do all we can to help our poor brothers and sisters at St. Bertin. We know that one of the most practical steps to alleviate their poverty is through education.

Haiti is one of the poorest countries in the world. Currently, the majority of Haitians lack access to quality education, a prerequisite for sustained social and economic development. The OLOL Haiti Mission is committed to improving the quality of, and access to, education for the children in Petit Bourg. We believe it is their greatest hope for a brighter future.

Every summer, OLOL Haiti Mission undertakes its annual campaign to raise funds for the ongoing operation of St. Bertin School. During the 2017-2018 school year, more than 750 students were able to attend the preschool, primary and secondary schools at St. Bertin, thanks to the generosity of OLOL parishioners. Without your help, many of these children would not be able to attend school, because their parents cannot afford to pay full tuition. Also, our support ensures a worthy wage for the teachers of St. Bertin School, which allows them to support their families. In addition, last year OLOL donors made possible the construction of a new sanitary latrine system, an important improvement for the health and wellbeing of the students.

The 2018-2019 school year, will be a milestone year for St. Bertin School. The Secondary School will be fully developed, offering 7th, 8th, and 9th grade classes. For the first time ever, students at St. Bertin can complete their foundational education, which will open the door to greater opportunities in the future. OLOL donations and prayers made this dream become a reality.

This year's fundraising campaign will kick off at weekend Masses on July 28-29. We need to raise \$50,000 for the 2018-2019 school year to achieve two important goals:

- Complete the expansion of the new secondary school with the addition of the 9th grade class
- Continue support for the ongoing operation of the preschool and primary School

We hope everyone will consider making a donation to help us achieve these goals.

Father Jean Baptist Geordani, pastor of St. Bertin, and secondary school principal Marc Endy Saintil will visit OLOL during the campaign to thank everyone in person for supporting the ongoing success of St. Bertin School.

We thank and praise God for the opportunity to serve his people at St. Bertin. With your support, we are making a real difference in the lives of many poor children by making it possible for them to receive a quality education. With this amazing gift, these children will be empowered to make a positive impact in their community and improve the quality of life in Haiti in the future. 
COMING IN SEPTEMBER: EVANGELIZATION SERIES
