How are we going to do that? Here are the short and sweet highlights of our plan.



Mission for St. Bertin in Haiti

As co-chairs of OLOL's mission for St. Bertin, we want to thank everyone for your faithful support for our twin parish in Haiti.

As you know, Haiti is a very poor country. It is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. The village of Petit Bourg de Port Margot where St. Bertin is located is also very poor. They cannot do much without our help. On behalf of the people of St. Bertin, thank you for your ongoing support for St. Bertin through the green envelopes and your support for our medical and dental missions, construction projects, and sea container shipments. You will be pleased to know that a portion of the money we send on a monthly basis is used to help for the poorest of the poor through COPES, which is the St. Vincent de Paul Society ministry at St. Bertin.

Because of you, St. Bertin School is the best Catholic school in the region, and many children receive a very good education. Thanks to you, more than 600 students receive a Catholic education at St. Bertin School, and teachers are able to make a worthy wage, allowing them to support their families.

We are very excited that this year, St. Bertin will add a secondary school beginning with 7th grade. Parents are very happy that their children can now continue their education beyond the 6th grade. Marc Endy Saintil, former student of St. Bertin School, is the principal of the new secondary school. Marc Endy loves St. Bertin and has worked hard to open the new school for the 2016-2017 school year. He is very grateful to OLOL for making this dream come true for the children of St. Bertin.

We want to assure you that we work very hard to ensure accountability for the funds you donate for St. Bertin. We visit St. Bertin once or twice each year. In October, we will make our 20th trip. During every visit, we meet with Father Jean Baptist Geordani, pastor of St. Bertin, and the school administrators to review the use of the funds that we send for the operation of the church and school. We have a very thorough process for vetting requests for special projects. We are happy to help our poor brothers and

sisters in Haiti; however, at the same time, we are committed to maximizing the investment made possible by your donations, making sure that these funds are used in ways that will yield the greatest impact and benefit to the St. Bertin parish community.




Women Within to Host the 3rd Annual Margaritaville

Can You Spare One Hour to be with Jesus?

"Could you not stay awake just one hour with Me?" That is the question Jesus posed to Peter and the Apostles during his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. Now he is asking it of you. Can you not spend just one hour a week with Jesus in our Adoration Devotion? He is waiting for you in our Adoremus Chapel. He is present body and blood, soul and divinity in the sacred Host. There is a Bleeding Host enshrined in a church in Santarem, Portugal (from 1247). The DNA of Blood from this Host was tested and its DNA is an exact match to the DNA found in the Blood and Tissue of a similar Eucharistic Host in Lanciano, Italy. Both of these proved to be an exact match of samples of the Blood of Our Lord taken from Jesus' Burial Shroud of Turin. If you would like to spend an hour a week in the real presence of Jesus, consider signing up for Eucharistic Adoration. Capital Campaign Update

Our dream has come true and our prayers have been answered!! Our new facilities are complete and we are now enjoying our beautiful new space. Our parish community has more than doubled in size over the past 17 years since we built our existing facilities. And now, we have doubled the size of our parish facilities, adding 14 new classrooms/meeting rooms, our new multi-purpose room called St. Joseph Hall, and improved traffic flow/parking on our parish campus.



These new facilities will have a profound impact on our parish community for many years to come. We now have the space we need for worship, learning, faith formation, parish ministries, gatherings of our parish community and serving others into the future.

Of course, the successful completion of the Forward in Faith capital campaign is vitally important to the financial health of our parish. Managing the mortgage, the cost of new furnishings and the ongoing operating expenses of our new facilities depends on the continued prayers and support of our entire parish community.

We are making good progress in meeting our financial goals through the Forward in Faith campaign. We have received pledges from 1000 families for more than \$5.3 million, which means we are almost 90 percent of the way toward our \$6 million pledge goal. And, we have received more than \$3.3 million in donations, which means we are on track with pledge fulfillment.

For those of you who have not yet made a pledge or donation, please know that it is not too late. We need the support of every family and encourage you to consider a pledge or donation based on your ability to give.

Please plan to join us for the dedication of our new facilities on Monday, August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. We will begin the celebration with Mass at 6 p.m., followed by a ribbon cutting, the blessing and dedication and a reception. I hope everyone will join us for this very special celebration.

We can all be proud of what we have accomplished and look forward to celebrating together on August 15.
