Dear Friends:

Bishop David Choby was a very dedicated and caring pastoral leader who loved Our Lord and loved his ministry as bishop of our diocese. Bishop Choby's long service to the people of Sumner County as a local pastor and then later as our bishop endeared him to many in our area, Catholic and non-Catholic alike. I am very grateful personally for the kindness, friendship, encouragement and support that he consistently gave to me. In these recent days, many of you have likewise expressed your affection for him and your gratitude for his pastoral leadership. Although his passing was met with sadness for our loss, the beautiful celebration of his funeral mass, and the occasions of prayer surrounding it, were also strong affirmations of the Catholic Faith that was so near and dear to his whole life. He will certainly be missed. May he Rest in Peace.

Fr. Michael Johnston has very graciously accepted the position of serving as administrator of our diocese. Fr. Johnston has a long history of distinguished service as a priest and pastor. He is a very capable leader and a very thoughtful and caring priest who will continue the smooth and efficient operation of our diocese and the harmonious continuation of its many ministries. He will continue to serve in this leadership capacity until the time that our Holy Father, Pope Francis, will choose a new bishop for the Diocese of Nashville. While he will assume many of the canonical responsibilities of a bishop, he will not have the ability to ordain priests or to appoint pastors (for the first year of his administration). In the meantime, he will have the ability to appoint administrators for parishes that are lacking a pastor at this time. Please pray for Fr. Johnston and for all who serve in pastoral leadership in our diocese.

I am very happy to welcome two seminarians who are assigned to Our Lady of the Lake during their summer break from studies. As you know, fostering vocations to the priesthood was a great emphasis of Bishop Choby's ministry, and a testimony to your vibrancy as a parish that the bishop chose to send seminarians here each summer as part of their priestly formation. I know that you will join me in welcoming Sam Browne and Juan Carlos Garcia to our parish and will make them feel very much at home.


The summer is a time when parish leaders plan for upcoming events and opportunities that will begin in proximity to the start of a new school year. In particular, a great deal of thought and reflection have

Prior to our current building on Stop 30 road, OLOL occupied a building on New Shackle Island Road. Because the building was sold and demolished several people have asked where it was located. You can see that the location is across from the Sonic and was at the corner of New Shackle Island and Iris Drive. RCIA: Thoughts from class of 2017

From the first spark of recognition to the flame of intimacy, God's presence in the journey of our RCIA class remains a gift and a great mystery! Once again this past year we had an amazing class of 37 candidates and catechumens and an equally amazing group of sponsors.

From sacraments to symbols, from praying to presence, and reconciliation to restoration, we have learned so very much about how God draws his people to himself and speaks to each of us as we come together to seek, listen and learn about his great love.

As one candidate said, "It is an opportunity to look at my faith and learn about the Catholic church."

Another shared the following: "When I came to RCIA it was my first day in a Catholic church. As a child, I was taught that Catholics didn't believe in Jesus. The loving gentle teaching the RCIA staff taught me the truth.... this is the church that Jesus started. We ask the saints to pray with us, I AM AT HOME. I have an entire family in Heaven and I will never be alone again. I have laughed and cried and come to adore my new Christian home."

Finally, this comment, "RCIA has led me into a new life full of joy and meaning!"

In the end, our parish is stronger, more vibrant and more fully the family of God when our candidates and catechumens become a part of our journey to heaven, on earth and beyond.

Our RCIA journey for the coming year will begin on Sunday, September 10, 2017. We will meet in classroom number 206/207 every Sunday from 9:40AM to 10:50AM. Pre-registration for RCIA is not required, simply join us on Sunday, September 10th.


Eucharistic Adoration



OLOL Mission for St. Bertin in Haiti

"Poverty is not an accident...It is man-made and can be removed by actions of human beings." - Nelson Mandela

Through our mission for St. Bertin, our twin parish in Petit Bourg de Port Margot, Haiti, OLOL is taking action to fight poverty in this poor, rural Catholic community. Thanks to the generosity of OLOL parishioners, we are building hope for a brighter future through our support of St. Bertin School.

During the month of June, OLOL Haiti Mission has conducted its annual "Building Hope Together" fundraiser for the school. The donations to the campaign make it possible for 650 children to receive a quality education. Without the support of OLOL, very few of these children would be able to attend school. Their parents could never pay full tuition, and the teachers would never receive the wages or training that are required to give the children access to a quality education. But, thanks to OLOL parishioners, we have been able to build a foundation of hope for thousands of families at St. Bertin.

The 2016-2017 school year was pivotal for St. Bertin with the successful opening of the new secondary school. Principal Marc Endy Saintil attended St. Bertin School as a child, and he made it his personal mission to give back to the school by making it possible for students to continue their education beyond the sixth grade. This school year, 53 students attended 7th grade. Over the next two school years, 8th and 9th grade classes will be added. This is a significant breakthrough, since only 20 percent of eligible-age children in Haiti are able to attend secondary school.

This year, we need to raise \$50,000 to achieve three important goals:

- ♦ Continue expansion of the new secondary school by adding the 8th grade class;
- Support continued operation of the preschool and primary school;
- Construct a new latrine system to replace current unsanitary facilities.

We were very pleased to have Marc Endy (pictured above) visit OLOL to meet parishioners and to talk about the successful progress of the school. He enjoyed his first visit to the US and appreciated the warm welcome he received at OLOL. As of June 14, we are 85 percent of the way toward reaching our goal, with collections totaling \$42,000. We want to thank everyone for taking action and helping to create a brighter future for the children of St. Bertin.


