- Classes for Pre-School, age three by Sept. 8th, 2019 (children must be potty trained)-5th grade will be held on Sunday mornings from 9:40 a.m.-10:50 a.m.
- Classes for 6th-8th grade will be held on Wednesday evenings from 6:15 p.m.-7:45 p.m. Students will attend a youth Mass the first Wednesday of the month. Parents are encouraged to attend the Mass.

All students seeking sacraments should complete at least two years of Religious Education prior to the sacramental year to be fully prepared. Students preparing to receive the sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation are required to attend class weekly. More than five absences will likely result in delay of the sacrament. Seven Sisters of the Apostolate

In July, the Seven Sisters of the Apostolate hosted Father Luckas for lunch. The purpose was to introduce him to the seven ladies who had been praying for him this year. The apostolate had been formed shortly after he left for his assignment in India. Two other apostolates also exist in our parish; one for Father Eric and one for Father Thomas. There are many all over the country.

The Seven Sisters of the Apostolate is a ministry of prayer for our pastors. The coordinator for the Nashville Diocese is one of our own parishioners, Rosemary Geiger. Seven Sisters is about seven women who choose one day a week to spend one hour in adoration praying for the priest. You can choose any hour of that day, but it must be the same day each week. There are no meetings to attend.

Father Luckas is a former associate pastor of OLOL. Father Luckas' order is the Missionaries of St. Francis De Sales. This order established a mission in Tamil Nadu, in southern India. Desiring to obey the local MSFS Superior, Father accepted his request to come care for the Catholics that needed a pastor. Father says life there is challenging. It gets very hot and dusty, to which he has an allergy. Then comes the monsoon season, and there are cyclones. Water, food, and medical services are scarce. The people are very poor. Soon after arriving, Father had a well dug for water. A pump and

filter were also needed. For medical care for his people he travels to a nearby town to hire a doctor or nurse if he has the funds. He is two hours from the nearest hospital. He hopes to buy a van to help transport the sick and elderly for medical care as well as for gathering them for Mass. Father serves five missions with different numbers of families in each one. He travels between them on a motorcycle, some taking 35 minutes or more from one to another. He also helps a primary school with an orphanage. Evangelization

"Christ yesterday, today and forever." Hebrews 8:13

Evangelization is truly an ongoing process in which we daily renew our personal transition and often a metamorphosis in which we truly allow Christ to be the center of our lives. This process very much brings us to our higher self, so to speak, as we continue to unite with our whole person which includes our mind, our body, and our soul in the pursuit of holiness. Sure we are all "rough around the edges" which often includes the many wounds of life, and yet we are called to continue our journey in life to become the best, the most unique individual who is spiritually retooled by the Potter, Jesus Christ himself, because we are the clay, we were created as such.

When evangelist Matthew Kelly visited us a few years ago, he challenged us to become the best representation of our self because this would be our great quest for our unique holiness which we all are called to become and this is the best representation of Christ in our world. Yes we reach for the best within ourselves we truly mimic Jesus Christ and we often become the only Christ that so many people in our world will ever encounter.

In the mid-70s I had the opportunity of learning from a great person, teacher and mentor Og Mandino shared with us his most tragic life leading up to his transformation which ultimately placed him as one of the great writers of our time. He is best recognized as the author of the Greatest Salesman in the World which continues to be number two in print right behind the Bible itself. I have had the opportunity of reading most of his writings and I must admit I am probably most moved by the smallest book I've ever read entitled, "God's Memorandum". This book may very well appear to be so simple and yet so profound, as well as humbling as it invites us to enter into an understanding about ourselves and God's master plan for all creation. As one reads this profound book of how to become spiritually retooled so that each of us continues to pursue our holiness as our personal quest and simultaneously share with all we encounter the present (gift) of the risen Christ always which is always cognizant in our minds, in our lives, and in our hearts. The spiritual energy within each of us becomes intense as we pursue our holiness and thereby share in the spirit of Christ in a very special way so that we become mindful of Christ and filled with enthusiasm (Greek meaning "God within") as we do this we become authentic and transparent with the spirit of honesty, responsibility, integrity, courage, and persistence. The gift of Evangelization is first on our own evangelization of ourselves and the only way that we can continue to grow in evangelization is to share it with others as we were instructed by the most recent popes all of whom emphatically stated that the most important work that we have in our church is Evangelization. The great theologian, scientist, evangelist and teacher Teilhard de Chardin shares with us his perception of evangelization as he states: "may the Lord preserves in us all a passionate zest for the world, much gentleness, and may he help us be more fully human to the end." These inspiring words become our Mantra as we evangelize to all the risen Christ

Mission for St. Bertin in Haiti

The annual fundraiser for the school at St. Bertin, our twin parish in Haiti, began this past July. Our goal was to raise \$55,000 this summer for the 2019-2020 school year and we exceed it. Thanks to the faithful and generous support of OLOL parishioners during last year's fundraiser, 750 students received a quality education at St. Bertin preschool, primary and secondary schools during the 2018-2019 school year. Also, our financial support made it possible

for us to give the teachers a much-needed increase in wages and keep tuition at an affordable rate for parents.

The current socio-political crisis in Haiti reminds us that education is a vital priority. As you may know, Haiti is in a state of ongoing demonstrations and violence. Tens of thousands of people have taken to the streets to protest widespread government corruption, economic mismanagement and human rights abuses. The national economy is deteriorating rapidly. The value of the Haitian Gourde against the US dollar continues to decline at the same time the rate of inflation is skyrocketing. These developments have taken a significant toll on impoverished rural communities, like Petit Bourg de Port Margot where St. Bertin is located. Ensuring quality education for the next generation is the greatest opportunity to invest in positive, systematic change for the future. By providing a quality education for the children of St. Bertin, we will empower them to improve the quality of life in Haiti and build hope for the future. Your continued prayers and support can and will make a real difference!

Fall Cursillo weekends are almost here. Weekends start on Thursday evening and end Sunday evening at Camp Marymount in Fairview, TN. There is no way to describe the effect a Cursillo experience can have on your life. Your environment, whether home, school, work or your parish will be greatly enhanced by your renewed joy and love of Christ. After the weekend you continue to be encouraged to live a Christian life by involvement in a small group that meets with the purpose of strengthening each other to bring Christ into the lives of all they come in contact with.
